Chan Lowe was editorial cartoonist for the Oklahoma City Times from 1978-1984. Prior to that, he was staff artist and editorial cartoonist for the Shawnee News-Star in 1975-77. He now is editorial cartoonist for the South Florida Sun-Sentinel in Fort Lauderdale.

Lowe was born in New York City in 1953, the son of Carol Channing. He was educated in New York, Los Angeles and England and was graduated from Williams College in 1975 with a degree in art history. He also spent a year studying at Stanford University as a John S. Knight Journalism Fellow in 1992-1993.

Lowe's awards include the Green Eyeshade Award in 1992, second place in the 1996 John Fischetti competition and he was winner of the National Press Foundation's Berryman Award in 2000. He was a finalist for the Pulitzer Prize in 1990.

His cartoons have appeared in numerous national publications including Newsweek, The New York Times, The Washington Post and USA Today. A sculpture by him was exhibited in 1997 at the National Gallery for Caricature and Cartoon Art in Washington, D.C. His cartoons are syndicated by Tribune Media Services.

Lowe's interests include history, woodworking and baroque music performance.
