As a freelance artist and owner of Stark Art and Yellow Lab Productions, Kevin first started working on the Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtle toy line in 1990. Working as a designer for the Turtles and other toy lines over the years, such as the Toxic Crusaders, The Mask, The Simpsons, The Pink Panther, Stretch Armstrong, Toonsylvania and Universal Studios' The Mummy, to name a just a few, Kevin has worked for clients around the globe through a company in southern California called the Pangea Corporation.

With the release of GEEZER COMICS, Kevin has been working on his own character, Geezer. Currently a comic book and a daily comic strip, Geezer is the story of a seventy nine year old super hero. Preproduction has started on an animated series and a line of action figures. And, of course, being the curator of an action figure museum, this has made Kevin very happy!

Along with Lenny Brumley and other creative thinkers, Kevin helped put together the beginnings of the Toy & Action Figure Museum in Pauls Valley in the year 2000. Getting its start from Kevin's massive toy collection, the museum opened in October of 2005 as the only museum of its kind in the world. Voted Best New Attraction in the State of Oklahoma for 2006 by the Governor's Conference on Tourism, the museum has gone on to fulfill its mission of being a unique attraction for Pauls Valley and bringing people from all over the world to the downtown area.

Kevin still lives in Pauls Valley, even as he continues to expand his talents in other artistic endeavors around the world. He is often seen at the museum and is always happy to give a tour, take a look at a young artist's portfolio, or do a free drawing for visitors. All you have to do is ask...
